Sub: Additional guidelines for conduct of examinations on adoption of 6th Deans committee recommendations for Graduate degree programme ... reg.

In pursuance of the above, the following modifications / additions were made to this office notification cited at ref (1) above, in respect of the guidelines for conducting of Examinations and Evaluation system as per 6th Deans Committee recommendations in line with the norms of Indian Council of Agricultural Research (ICAR) the University of Horticultural Sciences, Bagalkot for Graduate degree programmes from the academic year 2024-25 and onwards. The modifications/additions/details are as follows.

Examination and Evaluation System:

There will be a uniform system of the evaluation and grading to be followed with Grade point average (GPA) system. The following pattern of examination is adopted.

Evaluation system for 100 marks:

- ➤ For external theory examinations, the question paper will be obtained from the external experts. The Head of Departments of the respective departments will ensure due coverage of the syllabus with the provision of moderation, if necessary.
- Paper evaluation (External Exam) will be done by the course instructor(s) (other than course Teachers)/ Experts in the relevant subjects.
- > The evaluation of the Skill Enhancement courses (SECs) will be done as courses with practical only.

- Usually for any subject, there will be **two quizzes** within the semester, **one before the midterm and one after.** There will be provision of corrections in between, *i.e.*, the students scoring lower than 50% marks in any one quiz can opt for appearing for a **third quiz** toimprove their grades. The assessment of the students through quizzes should focus on their critical thinking and creativity rather than rote reading.
- The quiz and progressive assessment can also be considered in the form of group assignments (which should encourage creativity, critical thinking and problem solving attitude).
- The evaluation of internship will be done by both i.e., the parent institute and the host industry/ organization. It should be 50% weightage for each. The student shall submit a report to the parent institute and present the learning before the other students and faculty after the internship programme. The format of evaluation may be developed by the parent institute.
- The online/MOOC courses, successfully completed by the student, will be indicated in the transcript with 'Satisfactory' remark.
- When students take deficiency course(s), they will be assessed as 'Satisfactory' or 'Unsatisfactory' without any grade points.
- ➤ The evaluation will be done on a 10 point scale. 10 point = 100 marks
- The per cent of marks in a subject will be divided by 10 to obtain the grade point.

The grade point average for a semester will be calculated as follows.

$$GPA = \frac{\sum (Grade\ po\ \text{int}\ \times credit\ hours)_{inonesemester}}{Total\ credit\ hours\ \text{in the semester}}$$

The Cumulative grade point earned at any stage of the course will be calculated as cumulative grade point average (CGPA) as follows.

$$CGPA = \frac{\sum (Grade \ po int \times credit \ hours)_{untillast semester}}{Total \ credit \ hours \ until \ last \ semester}$$

Award of Divisions

The award of Divisions will be as follows:

If a student passes in a subject in a second attempt, for calculation of CGPA, the grade point for the subject in the second attempt will only be considered. The final CGPA will be named as overall grade point average (OGPA), which will be mentioned in the final transcript of the students.

- External Examiners for setting question papers to be selected from any of the farm universities including Karnataka, but other than UHSB.
- ➤ University head of the department has to send names and their full addresses (including email Id and mobile no.) of minimum 5 (five) faculties of farm universities of Karnataka to Controller of Examination not later than 4 weeks of start of the semester.
- > Controller of Examination will get the approval of the list of external examiners from the Director of Education.
- Controller of Examination will get two question papers from two different external examiners and will be checked for out of syllabus questions if any, by the Head of Department stationed at main campus in the CEEC only. Out of syllabus questions if any to be replaced by Head of Department and a statement saying "there are no out of syllabus questions are present in the question paper" to be written on the question paper and submitted to Controller of Examination.

3. For courses with Practical only the final practical examination question paper pattern (40 marks) shall be designed by respective course teachers. Further, Quizes, Practical exams are to be conducted at college level.

Note:

- 1) The minimum attendance of 80% is compulsory for a student to attend the final external examinations. Further, the attendance marks shall be awarded on pro-rata basis i.e., 80% attendance is equal to zero and 100% attendance equal to 05 marks.
- 2) Students must secure minimum 15 marks out of 40 marks in final examination and total of 50 out of 100 marks to get "Pass" in any course.
- 3) Setting-up of question paper for Multi Disciplinary Courses (MDC) shall be done by Combining questions from different disciplines.
- 4) The other conditions as notified earlier remains unaltered.
- 5) Evaluation of Multi Disciplinary Courses (MDC) is suggested by framing questions under different disciplines in different parts i.e., A, B,C..

These regulations shall be applicable to the Graduate Programme students admitted from the academic year 2024-2025 and onwards.
